The latest accounts from Europe have astonished as by the intelligence, that Prussia has consented to shut alther ports against the British. All her resolutions in their favor; the flattering communication of their minister Baron Hardenberg to the English minister, "that after the unfortunate occurrences in Moravia, the utmost circumsfection was indispensible; that the most valiant armies could not always command the favors of fortune; that therefore it was not only the interest of Prussia but also the general interest, to prevent her from being attacked at that moment, when the whole weight of war would fall upon, and before any co-ofieration with other powers could be formed; that in case her troofs should be defeated, the last ray of hope would be exlinguished:" all these flattering indications are forgotten. It is not easy to assign the change of policy; but there can not be a doubt that Bonaparte is the hero of the drama; that it is his intrigue which has induced Prussia to depart from her established system of neutrality.

It is an idle expectation that Bonaparte will step here in the accomplishment of his plans. The object neavest his heart is t e reduction of the British commerce; and the voluntary humiliation of Prussia has thrown some of the means of effecting this object, into his power. He will not rest satisfied with slauting the British commerce out of all the ports of Prussia; his policy will be to shot it completely out of the Baltic. She has already consented to shut up all her ports against the British; and[willscarcely object to shutting them out of all the other ports of the Baitie.
