so that the public have a further advantage of
one ounce in the five cent loaf, and assures
them that they shall be supplied at all times
with Bread on as good terms as stated in his
former publication as the price of flour will
admit of; at the same time begs leave to re-
turn his sincere thanks to the ladies and gentle-
men for the great encouragement he has re-
ceived and apologises for not having been able
at all times to supply them with bread, which
has been owing to the great demand; and in-
forms them that he will as soon as convenient,
build two large additional ovens, and will have
in a few days carts out to supply those families
he has been obliged to refuse, and be enabled to
bake sufficient for his demands. Superfine flour
