the neighborhood thereof.

Bill, cousin to Simon & Michael, is a bright  
mulatto, about twenty-three years of age, nearly  
6 feet high; has lost two of his upper fore teeth,  
and stammers in his speech; he went away last  
Sunday night. Had on nankeen pantaloons and  
kersey round jacket.
