THE Commissioners appointed under a decree of the honorable chancellor of Maryland to divide the property held in company, by Daniel Bowly and Thomas Yates, have now completed the division;
And by order of Gabriel Wood and Edward Harris, esquires, (trustees of Yates and Campbell.)

The sale of Mr Yates's part, together with all the other property which he assigned to the said trustees, at the year 1860, for the use of Yates and Campbell's creditors, will commence at the vendue war-house, at the corner of Second and Frederick streets, on FRIDAY, the 11th of July, at 10 o'clock, precisely. The property is all in fee simple, and consists as follows:

Four Squares on the east side of Jones's Falls, on the south of Wilkes-street, which are laid off into 80 lots, fronting on the Falls, President, Albemarle, Orange, and Campbell streets.
