To the Editor, from his Correspondent at Norfolk, under date of July 27.
SIR,
The following is an extract from a letter received yesterday by the brig St. Brides, 15 days from Tortola, from Admiral Cochrane to Col. Hamilton, the British Consul. Yours, &c.
"Northumberland, off Tortola, July 12, 1806.
I have just a moment to tell you that we followed the French fleet to the west end of the Tortola passage, they going off before the wind—There were two 84's and four 74's—my force three 74's and one 64—had they kept their course I meant to have paid them a visit after dark, but they made sail to the northward, and I saw three more ships join—I then returned to Tortola, which island with the convoy was to have been destroyed the day I anchored.—I hope to be reinforced and get to see them to good purpose."
Norfolk July 25.
Captain Jones, of the British schooner Polly, in 21 days from St. Kitts, informs that on the 12th June, the fleet lying in Basseterre roads, received orders to anchor under Brimstone Hill. On the 3d of July the commodore made a signal for the fleet to slip, and put to sea, which was done instantly, and the convoy consisting of about 40 merchantmen, under convoy of two frigates, proceeded thro' the Sombro passage, and was all well on the 12th of July in lat. 28, 45, long. 64, 44, when captain J. putted company. Captain Jones further informs us that the Elephant of 74 guns arrived with the May convey, and is the fourth ship, whose name we did not know, but supposed was the Canopus, so that the squadron of admiral Cochrane is composed of the following:
