The London Courier of the 13th, contains the following singular article:— "A gentleman, just arrived from New-York, reports, that when he sailed, privateers were fitting out at that port in the expectation of a rupture with this country."

FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT We have received, by captain Deagle's Packet, Norfolk papers to the 2d instant, which furnish us with the following intelligence of the French & English fleets in the W. Indies.

Captain Nash, of the schooner Experiment, arrived there, in 14 days from St. Bartholomews, was boarded on the 17th instant off St. Martins, by a brig belonging to a British fleet, then in sight, consisting of ten ships. By this it appears, that admiral Cochrane has been reinforced, as he seemed to expect by his letter published in our paper a few days since. The fleet was under a press of sail in pursuit of the French fleet, which was spoken on the 25th ult. by captain Tarlington, on his passage from Antigua to Norfolk, exactly in the track of the valuable Jamaica convoy, consisting of nearly 200 sail, coming through the Gulf Passage— The French officer who boarded him, was particular in his enquiries about the arrival of a British fleet in the West Indies, and having got possession of an Antigua paper, stating the arrival of Sir J. B. Warren, he went with it instantly on board the admiral. What effect this information produced on the subsequent rout of the fleet we cannot say. They were discovered early in the morning under very easy sail, with their heads to the EASTWARD—when Captain T. lost sight of them they were under the same sail with their heads to the WESTWARD. Sir J. B. Warren passed Antigua the 14th of July in the morning, and if he procured information of the route of the French (which we not think very probable) he would be very soon up with them.

SAINT JOHN'S, (Antigua) July 15. An alarm was fired yesterday morning, upon the appearance of a squadron of men of war, which afterwards proved to be that under the command of vice-admiral Sir John B. Warren, consisting of the following vessels, viz.

The John Bull cutter, of 10 guns, had been detached on Sunday, to procure information respecting the course of the French squadron. The Amazon frigate touched at English Harbour, and immediately rejoined the fleet, which steered for St. Kitts.
