Adverting to the rumours of peace between France and Great Britain, and to the detailed progress of the negociation, as given in the London prints, we are much inclined to believe that the whole report is founded on conjecture—and probably squared to the interested views of those by whom the rumburs were propa-

That a negociation embracing so many disputed points, and involving questions of such magnitude and intricacy, should have even been set on soot, much less conducted to its close by a correspondence, between the ministers Fox and Talleyrand, in which but a few days had been employed, and only three or four dispatches exchanged, is by no means probable.—The bare approach to such a negociation, under the administration of the Directory, when Lord Malmsbury was the British negociator, occupied several weeks, and months clapsed before the discussion had reached to an explanation-of their respective pretensions.— Nor was the treaty of Amiens, conducted by Joseph Ronaparte on the side of France, and Lord Cornwallis on the part of Great Britain, brought to a close until efter a great lapse of time, and difficulty of discussion.

That Malta, the Cape of Good Hope, . Hanover, the British commerce and mamuchtures, and the revolutions of Empire, enacted by the Emperor Napoleon, will be prominent points of negociation is to be presumed—but that agreement to limitthe building of ships of the line in the, manner stated, bad been proposed or acceded to, by either of the parties, oversteps probability, and exposes the whole statement as a conjectural tale.

There is not in any part of the rumour la single official notification, nor does it comport with the boasted secrecy of the present British Cabinet, that affairs of so much importance should be first disclosed on the Stock Exchange.


