RAN away on Saturday the 27th inst. from the country residence of the subscriber, a Negro Man called PETER, formerly owned by Mr. Joseph Young, of this city. He is about 5 feet 6 inches high, stout make, rather handsome than otherwise, has tolerable good teeth, was very lame when he went off, owing to the wheel of a carriage in cleaning it falling upon his foot; has a particular aversion to giving a direct answer; but always says, "I reckon," to every question the most positive; and is constantly talking to himself as if grumbling. His clothes were numerous, among them was a blue cloth coat, a brown cloth coat, rather rusty, though not much worn; a dove colored twilled nankin coat, considerably faded from washing, the sleeves of which have been let out; several han'some Marseilles vests of different patterns, all very short; shirts of fine white Irish linen, pantaloons and gaiters of India nankeen, very good, and of the present mode; a fashionable Beaver hat, quite new made; his name in the crown, Wm. ON application to the Judges of the said County Court, by petition in writing of William Starr, surviving partner of William Starr and Joseph Price, of said County, praying the benefit of the "Act for the Relief of sundry Insolvent Debtors," passed at November Session, E-teen Hundred and Five, on the terms mentioned in the said Act; a schedule of his property and a list of his creditors, on both, as far as he can ascertain them, as directed by the said Act, being annexed to his petition; and the said County Court being satisfied by competent testimony, that the said William Starr has resided the two preceding years within the State of Maryland, prior to the passing of said Act; and the said William Starr, at the time of presenting his petition as surviving partner of William Starr and Joseph Price as aforesaid, having produced to the said Court, the assent in writing of so many of their creditors as have due to them the amount of two thirds of the debts due by them at the time of passing the said Act. It is thereupon adjudged and ordered, by the said Court, that the said William Starr, (by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some one of the daily papers of the city of Baltimore, for three months before the seventh day of October next) give notice to their creditors to appear before the said County Court, at the Court House in the said county, at ten o'clock in the forenoon of the said seventh day of October next, for the purpose of recommending a trustee for their benefit, on the said William Starr, then and there taking the oath by the said Act prescribed for delivering up their property.
