FROM JAMAICA PAPERS, Received at the office of the N. Y. Commercial Advertiser.

KINGSTON, (J.m.) August 30. The Fearet brig, of 18 guns, the Hon. Captain Cadogan, sailed on Sunday morning for Coro, on the Spanish Main, having on board Captain J. mes Ledlie, of the Columbian Army, who returns with answers from Sir Eyre Coote and Admiral Dicres to the dispatches addressed to them, and received here on the 15th inst. from General Francisco de Miranda.

We understand that the Heads of our Government have expressed thems.lves in high terms of approbation of the laudable pur poses General Miranda is aiming a, and regret much that they are precluded from giving him the assistance which his views demand, as they cannot take so great a responsibility on themselves, not having had any communication from his Majesty's Ministers on the subject. It is n uch to be lamented that no assistance could be afforded the Gene, rel from this quarter, as we are well assured that a few hundred men, tolerably disciplined, would have effected all he wished for in a lew weeks, a junction with a considerable body of man now encamped ready to join him; but which he canot attempt with the force at present under his command.

The Stork sloop of war, of 18 guns, Captain Le Goyt: the Flying Fish schr. of 12 guns, Lieut. Price, and the Pine to the Army, b inging with him such schooner, of five guns, Lieut. Outley, sail.d on Monday for Coro.

If the Dutch and Portuguese were able, in former times, to throw off the yoke of Spanish oppression; if the Swiss, and Americans, our neighbors, have equally succeeded to establish their liberry and a dependence with the general applaure of the world, and to the benefit of their inhabitants, when each of their, separately, scarcely contained two or three millions of people-Why then shall we, who are at the least sixteen millions, not be able easily to extricate ourselves! Possessing besides, over and above these considerations, the most fertile, in xhaustible and rich continent in the known world? The fact is, that it depends solely upon our own will-and that the will, progressing to our indep ndence, Union will assure to us permanent and perpetual happiness: the Divine Providence ordain it, to alleviate the miseries of our unhappy countrymen, and for the protection and benefit of the human species!

Those people who are timorous or less instructed, and who wish to inform themselves of the ground work of the justice and equity which those proceedigns require-joined to the historical truths that prove the inconceivable ingratitude, unheard of cruelties, and atrocious persecution of the Spanish Covernment, towards the innocent and unliarpy inlinbitants of the New World, almost from the moment of its discovery, will read the subjoined address of Dun Juan Piscardo, of the order of Jerus, directed to -lis countrymen, and they will find in it irrefregable proofs, and solid arguments in favor of our cause, dictated by a Holy Man, at a time when he was about ta king his leave of this world, to appear desore the creator of the Universe.
