It was shortly discovered that the stronge ship was an enemy and a line of battle ship. She was observed to board five sail during the day which were set on fire. Another sail was distinguished to leeware, bearing S. by E. which had also the appearance of a man of war, and as a fire was discernible in that direction, she was also judged to be an Enemy. From the situation in which the fleet was when the Osborne escaped it is strongly to be apprehended, that the entire of it was scither captured or destroyed. We are not specially informed of the fate of the Champion, from the short distance she was from the enemy, her escape was considered impossible.
