NASSAU, N. P. September 16. On Sunday last, we were again visited by a very severe gale, more violent than the one we experienced on the 21st of last month. It commenced from the northward, early in the morning...

We have been obligingly favored with Trinidad papers of the 20th of September, containing the following translations of intercepted letters from several gentlemen at Lagaira to their friends at Cumana. These letters were written while Miranda and his troops were in possession of Ojora...

The slaughter-house, which was the property of Mr. Richards, who had been long in possession of the premises along the bay, sustained considerable injury, and a number of fences and trees in the town and its vicinity were blown down...

September 19.—By an arrival yesterday from Harbor Island, we learn, they experienced the most severe and disastrous hurricane, that ever was known in the memory of the oldest inhabitants there...

September 23.—Since our last, by an arrival from Euterphria, we are informed, that the late gale has done extensive damage to the buildings and crops there. The dwelling house of Mr. Benjamin Claxton, at the plantation of Mr. George Butler, was blown down...

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At Royal Hill, two dwelling houses belonging to Mr. Benjamin Bunce, were blown down; his negro houses and other property also received considerable damage.

The ship Anna, Sellers, brig Lucy Ann, Pawford, and schr. Wolf, Jones, have arrived at Charleston.

The ship Traveller, Snow; Harriet Merkins, and Harriet, Edwards, from Baltimore, have arrived at Richmond. The Six Sisters, Snowden, from Bristol for Baltimore, had sprung a leak and put into St. Michaels in distress. After having stopped the leak in part, she sailed from thence the 12th Sept.

The ship Lovely Nan, 56 days from Amsterdam for Baltimore, was spoken on the 4th Oct. in lat 41, 32, long 58, having suffered severely from bad weather. The Rising Sun, of Baltimore, was left at Amsterdam, Aug. 12th, to sail the 14th; Harlow, and Sally, Gordon, to sail the 27th.

The fire which occasioned the alarm on Saturday evening, originated in an old stable in Vulcan alley. The stable was consumed, which was the only damage sustained.

It was a current report here yesterday, that Mons. Turrau had made a formal demand on our government for 80,000 POUNDS STERLING, for the French ship L'Impetueux, lately burnt by the British within the jurisdiction of the U. States! For the truth of this we cannot vouch, but this much is certain, that government have directed commodore Baron and his brother captain J. Baron, to survey the situation of the ship when destroyed, and that they went from this place yesterday for that purpose.

By late advices from the Mediterranean, we learn that war has been declared between the Bey of Tunis and the Dey of Algiers; occasioned by the refusal of Tunis to pay the stipulated tribute to Algiers, in which the former is said to be countenanced by the Porte. The Bey of Tunis has raised an army of 70,000 men, and the Dey of Algiers one of 60,000; the latter with the avowed purpose of attacking Tunis. His troops manifested some repugnance to marching, until they were tempted by the offer of the plunder of the town. No accounts have been received of the meeting of these armies, from which we may expect a bloody combat. The Tunisian cruisers had already entered the harbors of Algiers, and committed considerable depredations, and Algiers had sent out several cruisers to intercept Mellli Mellli.

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
