RATISBON, August 2. Bull and authentic extracts of the trea;y of confederation signed at Paris, July 12 and 17, 1805.

Experience has shewn that the German Consultution is by no means sufficient for securing foreign and domestic peace to the south of Germany. Therefore have the following high contracting parties agreed upon the articles as follows; viz-France on the one part, and on the other Bavaria, Wurtemburgh, Baden, Cleves and Berg, H.sse Darinstadt, Nassau, Weilburg and Usingen; Hanenzollern, Hechingen and Stegmeringen; Sahn Salm and Salm; Kyrburg, I enburgh, Ar mberg, Lichtenstein, and the Count of Leyen.

Article I. The above German Powers separate themselves for ever son the league of the German Empire, And form an union by the name of the Confederation of the Rhip:

II. All proceedings of the Empire are henceforth null and void, in so far as respects the above parties.

III. They renounce all the officers and titles of the Empire. Declare their separation as from the 1st of August, at the assembly of the Empire at Ruisbon. IV. The Elector-1 Arch Chancellor receives a new title, " Prince Primate

and most Screne Eminence." V. The Electoral Prince of Baden, the Duke of Berg and the Landgrave of Dormstadt, receive the titles "Grand Duke and Royal Highness," accompanied with royal honors.

VI. Frankfort on the Mayne is the seat of the contederation. The members form two colleges, the one royal, and the other princely.

VII. The members, in order to break off all dependence upon foreign powers, shall not remain in any foreign service. Whoever will not renounce such foreign service or dependence, s all deliver up mis States to one of his children.

VIII. No one can di nate his sovereignty in any other manner than as a confederated onc.

IX. All quarrels shall be decided by the me ting of the confederation at Franklort. X. The Presidency thereof belongs to the Prince Primate When divided into

two colleges, he shall be President of the R yalo, e, and the Duke of Nassau of the princely. XI. Four weeks after the Declarations at Ratis son, the Prince Prince shall propose a Constitutional Statute, which

small fix the ime and manner of the Convocation, the order of the Diliberations, and the form of the Ass mbly. XII. The Emperor Napole m'shall be proclaimed Protector of the confideration. In this quality he shall appoint the Successor to the Price Primate as often

[Here follows the detail of the divisions, by which several of the considerable principalities are to be parcelled out, under two, three, and more new sovereigns. For instance, the Hohenloe Country is parcelled out under Bavaria and Wurtemburgh; the Taxis country under thr.e, and the Furstenberg under four different sover.igns.]

XXV. Also, all possessions of Knights, companions of the Empire are deposed. Should there be any property lying in the middle between two of the confederate states, such property is to be divided into two equal parts between the two sovereigns.

XXVI. Definition of the rights of They comprehend the legislation, the highest jurisdiction, civil policy, military conscriptions and contributions of the sovereignties. XXVII. The deposed Princes and

Counts retain their domains and their rights as landlords, &c. XXVIII. They shall retain, in crimi-

nal cases, the privilege of the Austregal-Instantz for their persons. XXIX. The expences of war shall be proportioned among the Consederates ac-

cording to circumstances. XXX. The new Sovereigns shall take. upon themselves a certain part of the debts of the deposed Princes and Counts. XXXI. Every Member must reside

within the confines of the Confederated -Country. XXXII. The officers of state, if not retained by the new, shall be pensioned. XXXIII. Members of Military or Spiritual orders, who lose their posses-
