No nation has more systematically oppressed the commerce of other powers than England: the principles of eight has with her been plastic to the pretext of expediency; and, having the power, she has for a long number of years made the whole world tributary to her cupidity. The gigantie power of France on the continent, directly or indirectly reaching every state, en bles her to aim a blow at the commercial greatness of Britsin, which may be mortal. At any rate, the ugn the probibitory system be in many points evaded, it will be carried into effect to a considerable extent. If in no other war, by increasing t'e price, it will lessen the consumption of British fabricks and offer a premium to demestic marufactures. Nor is it prob ble that the system of Bonaparte will be as evanescent as most of those which have heretofere been planned. What great plan, conceived by him, has he aband, ned? And how few are the number of those which, having formed, he had failed to cir ct ? Animated by a strong and perhaps inextinguishable ammosity against britain, and supported in this instance by a general sense of retributive justice, have we any reason to doubt his persoverance? Does he not realize what all Europe perceives, that there are but two powres in that quirter of the world, and that, consequently, whatever

Britain loses he gains? But this subject will be best brought | home to our feelings by two considerations which principally affect us.

While the greater part of Europe are resisting the monopolizing spirit of Britain, would it be wise in us who principally teel her aggressions, to relax our résistance ? Is not this, of all times the attend. most seasonable, to urge our claims, if We promise ourselves success?

Will not Britain have discernment enough to perceive that, however desireus we may be to be on terms of emity with her, we are bound to pursue our interests, and maintain our honor, which can only be done by resisting the unjust encroachments on neutral rights? And will she, when she is so powerfully pressed by the governments of Europe, and must be in a state of fearful apprehension with regard to the result, will she, under these critical circumstances, persist in that ill-starred policy which will inevitably deprive her altogether of our friendship, and in no inconsiderable degre of our custom likewise? If she is wise, she will treat us with justice, the great man that presides over her councils, with charateristic magnanimity, will call upon us to forget the past, to shake hands in token of future good will, and we shall receive reparation. for our injuries, and the assurance of good
