Hatteras Light House - By a gentleman just arrived in town from Cape Hatteras we learn that the dome of that building has suffered considerable injury in the la'e storms; and that the keeper purposes to discontinue the Light till the linthern is thoroughly repaired. It seems to be material to the safety of vessels navigating that coast that this fact should be made public; lest by endeavooring to make the Light, as customary, they should run on shure by mistaking their distance from danger. We are rether surprised that we have not seen any official notice of this very m terial accident; seeing that some weeks have elapsed since it happened.

We have been favored with the fellowing account of the late storm.

SEELL CASTLE, S p. 29. About 12 o'clock last evening a galo at E. N. E. commenced and increased in its violence until about 4 A M. when it shifted to E. S. E. and bl. w the most tremendous storm ever I h lieve witnessed by a human b.ing, until six o'clock, when it got lurther to the Southward, &c finally to W. S. W. where it still continues to blow with excessive force. The custer belonging to this station under the command of Capt. Henderson, upset and sunk at her anchor-He, thank God, with five of the crew are saved, three poor fellous belonging to her, are lest the runmes are Freederick Clerry, Jacob, (a R. soisian,) and J. G. Roman.
