Le Morrigu Mara The recelit clipinges Mit the constitution of the Germanic Empiremes of such an extraordinary nature that if requires considerable reflection to ascertain precisely the magnitude of the alteration's efficied by Bonaparte. The constitution of Germany which, with some Mnovatious, his existedique since. the year 911 when the princes of the Empire, rejecting the Carlovingian race exalted Courade (the Duke of Francours) to the throne, has been completely over

Ever since the death of Lewis III, one of the heirs of Charlemagne, the monarchy of Germany has been elective, until the year 1805, when the present Francis. the second declared the right to the Imperial crown to be kereditury in the house of Austria. The arch duke of Austria, Albert the second, was elected Emperor of Germany about the year 1438; and the. dighity was continued in the male line of the same family until the year 1740, whenthe daughter of Charles the sixts, the empress-queen Theresa, inheritedein virtue' of the Pragmatic Sanction, (the elector of Bavaria having enjoyed the title of emperor for about five years during the wars of that period) and her husband, the duke of Lorraine, was elected Emperor, and hore the title of Francis 1. On his death, Joseph (the son of the Empress-queen) sucreeded him in 1765. To Joseph succeeded l'eter-Leopold; and to him in the early part of the French revolution, the present Francis the second, whose destiny has " shorne of its beams" the sun of his illustrious house; and degraded his title and his dignity, from the splendor of Emperor of G rmany, to the feeble lustre of Emperor of Austria; thereby reducing himself and his posterity to the same grade from which they originally sprung—'-imply, and in fact, to the station of Archdukes of Austria. Such is the fate of princes; subject in truth like the meanest of mankind to all the changes off ortune ...

In the weakness of Francis the seconds in the treachery of the princes of the south and west of Germany, and in that formidable mulitary force which he wields at pleasure, Bonaparte has found the in sains of instituting the confederation of the Rhine; and of placing himself at it: head as protector. Europe, astonished at the boldness of his plans, may complein of his innovations; but reflection will tell to the crowned heads of that continent and of the island of Great Britain, that they have been the true cause of the concentration of that tremendous military and civil power which now rests in the hands of the Emperor of the French and King of Italy. If Bonaparte was a First Consul, the gold of England and the sol. diers of Germany made him one; the same cause exalted him to the Imperial dignity, and in the to those atchieve ments which (if not in virtue yet in pow er) make him as a sovereign the complete parrallel of Charlemagne.

What will be done with the principalities of the north of Germany is uncertain. Whether the king of Prussia is to be rendered the protector of a confederation in that quarter, or whether any arrangements have been made with Russia on the subject, time will develope.

These surprizing revolutions on the. continent of Europe, must awaken in the minds of the princes of England the most fearful sensations; lest, in the jumble and consusion which Bonaparte occasions. among kingdoms and crowned heads, the degenerate descendants of the house of Este, the profligate and sottish Gualphis, might share a worse fate than the descendant of the house of Lorraine.

But what should chiefly attract and fix the attention of the American reader, is the lamentable sate which has attended the constitution of Germany. -The great outline of that constitution resembles, in many respects, the constitution of the U. States of America. Like the latter, the former consisted of a confederation of states; their diet resembled our Congress; their emperor (in prerogative) our president. What has occasioned the dissolution of the Germanic confederation ? What! Whys the local breils and squebbles of the individual states or princhalities of which it was composed. Those internal disagreements gave rise to the introduction of foreign influence, which, by dividing the members of the confederacy, finally overthrew the em-

Such, indeed will be the end of all consederacies, where local distinctions excited and give rise to national animient ty. Gen, Washington clearly saw the danger of such distinctions, and wisely warned his countrymenta avoid the evil. "One of the expedients; of particionic quire influence, within particular districts, (says the Gent in his farewell address) is to mistepresent the opinions and aims of other districts You/cannot shield your selves agormuch against the jealousies and heart burnisme, which spring from these misrepresentations.". Too much of the strict of local dissention has already prevailed in America.
