By the following extracts, it will be perceived, that the state of Mr. Fox's health was such that there was but little prospect of his recovery,

C. J. Fox was born on the 13th January. 1747, and came to Parliament in 1758. Jothing decisive, was probably known in London respecting the negociationsthe public mind was much perplexed with the uncertain state of this all important subject.

We received last night soms Dutch papers to Monday last, from which we 260 bbls. SUSQUEHANNAH HERRINGS. have given several extracts. They shew that France has taken alarm at the warlike preparations of Prussia and demanded an explanation. The cabinet of Berlin has answered, that they were for defensive purposes, by which an article under the head of Frankfort, affects to understand, that they are exclusively connected with the plan of the Northern Confederacy, and do not relate to France. We received also this morning The Leyden Gazette of he 2.1 Instant. It has copied from the Moniteur of the 26th, August, the orders for the march of the Austrian prisoners to Germany, and the return of the French troops to France before the last of September, but letters frem Suabia and Bavaria of a more recent date in the other Dutch Papers, are silent upon the subject. The Leyden Gezitte of the 2d contains a pritest of the King of Wirtemberg, against the cession of Tuttlingen to Baden, according to the 14th article in the Treaty of the Confederation of the Rhine, and offering an equivalent; and also a Proclamation of the Magistrates of Frankfort, recommending to the people acquiescence in itanew

> We know that many accounts equally authentic, were received in town yesterday, any one of which ought to have silenced the false reports of Mr. Fox's dissoluti n yesterday morning. At 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon we had further information that he he was still alive. A messenger arrived at that hour at his h use in Stable Yard, with orders for some aiticles wanted for his use. An account was at the same time received, stating that he was very low, but composed. Still however, the reports of his death were repeated with increased confid nce, by the ignorant, the credulous, and the designing. In the fact of his death, they were, indeed, allagreed; they only differed in the time. Some said it took place at five in the morning, others at ten. At eight o'clock, however, a bulletin, dit d Chiswick, 7 o'clock in the evening, of which the following is a copy was received by one of his particular friends in own:

> "Mr. Fox is still very ill, but his pulse is rether stronger than yesterday." "D. CLINE."

Notwithstanding these repeated assutrances of his being still alive, the rumour of his death had not ceased the whole of yesterday and last nigh . Lord. Robert Spencar lest town at seven o'clock last evening, for Chiswick; Lord Holland and Viscount Howic were also there, and proposed to remain during the night. Mir. Sheridan came to town in the morn; ing, and was unremitting in his enquiries. Saltpetred Hams, of the last year's curing, during the day.
