HOUSE OF DELEGATES

Monday, November the 10th, 1806. The house met-Present the same members as on Saturday—The proceedings of Saturday were read. Mr. Elijah Davis, a delegate returned for Harford county; mr. John Gale, mr. Levin Winder, and mr. Robert J. King, delegates returned for Somerset county, and mr. l'enjamin Hanson, a delegate returned for Kent county, appeared, and after qualifying in the mode prescribed by the constitution and form of government, and taking an oath to support the constitution of the U. States, took their seats in the

A petition from Rowland Overy, of Baltimore county, praying a law may pass annulling his marriage with Elizabeth. Sheppard, was preferred, read and referred to mr. Little, mr. Harryman, mr. Aisquith, mr. Bond, and mr. Street, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Little from the committee, delivers to the Speaker a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lettery for raising a sum of money for the use and benefit of the charitable marine society of the city of Baltimore; which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion, leave to bring in a bill, entitled, An act for the encouragement of learning in this state, and for other purposes therein mentioned. Ordered, that mr. Comegis, mr. Kerr, mr. Aisquith, mr. Belt. mr. Davis, mr. Bond, and mr. Gleaves, be a commit-

tee to prepare and bring in the same. The clerk of the Senate delivers the f flowing message:

By th Senate, Nov. 10, 1806. Gen. l. m. n of the House of Deregates, The Schate is formed and ready to proceed with the business of the session. We prepare immediately to go into the election of a Governor. Robt. Wright esq-

is put in nomination by this house, and we have appointed Mr. Gibson and Mr. Partridge to join such gentlemen as you may name for the examination of the

and report thereon. A petition from Patty Hosier of Worcester county, praying to be released from her marriage with Ely Hosier, was preferred, read and referred to the committee appointed on the preceding pe-

The bill to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the Council for the ensuing year, was sent to the Senate by the clerk.

By the House of Delegates, Nov. 10th. Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message, informing us that you are ready to proceed to business, and also proposing to go into an election for Governor, agreeable to the provisions of the Constitution and form of government; we having also organised our house, are ready to proceed to business, and to go into the election of a Governor. No person is put in nomination by us in addition to Robert Wright esq. Mess. Aisquith and Winder are appointed by this house to join the gentlemen appointed by you to examine the ballots.

By order, JNO. BRENER, Clk. The house having qualified, agreeably to the constitution and sermet government, proceeded to the choice of a governor, the ballots being deposited in the ballor-box, the gentlemen named to ftrike retired, and after some time returned and reported that Robert Wright, : sq. had a majority of votes.

Whereupon resolved, that Robert Wright, Esq. be and he is hereby declared to be governor of the state of Maryland,

The following message being read and agreed to, was sent to the senate by the clerk. By the House of Delegates, November 10.

Gentlemen of the Senate, Robert Wright, Esq. having been elected governor of this flate, we propose that a joint letter should be written by the president of the senate and speaker of the house of delegates, and immediately forwarded by express to notify him of his election, and to request his attendance, in order to be qualified according to the constitution and form of government.

By order, JOHN BREWER. The clerk of the senate delivered the bill to settle and ascertain the salary of the members of the council for the ensuing year. Endersed

" will pass"-ordered to be engrolled. On motion the question was put, will the house now proceed to a nomination for the members of the council. The Yeas and Nays being required, appeared as follow: -- Yeas 24-Nays 39.

So it was determined in the negative. The house adjourned until to-morrow morning, go'clock.
