POSTSCRIPT.

By the fhip Liberty, captain Chew, who arrived at this port yesterday, in 50 days from Liverpool, the editor of the Mercantile Advertifer has received a file of London papers to the evening of the 30th of Sept. Lloyd's Lists of the same date, and a Liverpool paper of the 2d October, the day previous to the vellel's failing.

The fellowing extracts, and a few articles of marine news, comprize whatever in thefe papers is politically or commercially interest-

London, September 29.

The Mails due on Sunday se'nnight and Wedneiday last, verived this morning. It is quite certain that Cararro is still in the hands of the Ruffans. It also appears, that Napoleon has been ditappointed in one effect which he expect-ed from D'Cubril's treaty. The figning of this treaty was notified to the Russian Commandant at Catarro, in the hope, that without farther orders he would give up the place. He seems, however, to have been too well acquainted with his duty as a seldier to be surprised into a surrender by fuch a stratagem as this-though the Austrians were to have been made instruments in the deception.

Appearances become every day more hostile

on the Continent. Foth France and Prussia prepare with great activity. Saxony is to furnish to the latter 26,000 men, and Prussa has a well appointed army ready for the held. ven Auftria, greatly to the credit of the Archduke Charles, has already teftored Ler army, and supplied her wasted magazines with a mis and military stores, and may foon be able to take a decided part in any new war that mis be provoked by the infatiable ambition of aparte. Our private Correspondent at Hamburgh. flates a report current there, that the mucror of Ruffia has taken possession of Prusia proper, and even Konigiberg itlelf, as a security that Prussia will act in concert with the Allies in the approaching war. If this be correct, we may foon expect to see Lord Lauderdale in Lon-

Ly letters from the Hague it appears that the greatest activi y prevails in the military preparations of the army of Holland.

It was understood at Paris, that Talley rand left that city on Friday, to follow his master; at least it was not doubted that he would join

There can now be no doubt whatever that he goes to head his army, and lead it against the King of Piussia. The Moniteur has not yet in any direct manner, alluded to the dispute tetween these Powers.

The general complexion of the French and Dutch Journals, compared with the accounts received by the Mails of yesterday, shew that war is now considered as inevitable between Prussia and France. The French accounts respecting Germany are never entitled to any credit, but from the great auxiety they manifest to falsify the statements from other quarters, they betray the feeling of the French Government on the contemplation of the present crisis-There are articles in the Moniteur from Cassel of the 13th, and Dressien of the 11th, in which Prussia is accused of an attempt to usurp over Saxony and Hesse #80vereighty much more direct and overbearing than the Emperor as head of the Germanic Body had ever claimed or exercised.

It is stated in the same articles, that the Elector of Heese had refused to ratify a treaty concluded at Berlin, in which the pretensions of Prussia were recognised. There is not the least evidence of such a subject of misunderstanding; for all the German accounts concur in the statement that the Hessians were to join the Prussians, and that the junction of a considerable body with General Ruchel has actually been effected. As to Saxony, which is represented equally averse to co-operate with Prussia, the fact is unquestionable, the whole of the Saxon troops are at the disposal of the Prussians, and the whole of the Saxon territory is occupied by them.

From every thing we can collect, the Pruffian army would be in the positions it intended to occupy about the end of this month. The French army could not be concentrated and put in motion besore that period. Bonaparte lett Parison the morning of the 25th, and could not be at Frankfurt before the 30th, nor commence operations till some days after.
