THE non-importation aft of the last section was evidently intended by congrets as an intimation to the British nation of the powerful means we policifed of feri ally annoying her, and as a manises a ion of our fixed determination of employing those means in case her deportment in relation to the United States thould not be come of a more friendly charaster. Upon this act of congrets was founded a special mission. And we are happy in leatning that the British government has met our ministers full half-way and upon ground very favorable to as. The Eritish commissioners Lord Holland and Auk. land have, we are affured, brought into the negoeile in di politions the most amicable. In this friendly flate of things, pending a negociation begun aud in her o conducted upon equitable and amicable principles, dies not liberality as well as found policy call upon congrets inmediately to suspend the non importation act. It is devoutly to be withe I that the pre deat will I in a the coal meffage recommend it to them. Sach a measure as politic as it would be magnanimous would obviouil, remove many obitacles now in the way of our able and virtuous ministers; and it would be a demonitration to the i right commissioners that our non-importation as would and ubitably go into full and complete operation in case the objects of our special of the following feems to exhibit a spirit in perfect unifon with the information on which their oblervations are founded.

Extract of a letter from Leeds, dated September 29, 1806.

" We duly received your favor of June 15th, and intended to have replied to it former, but By Cole & I. Bonsal, Auct'rs. of late have had time to attend to nothing but the manufactory, previous to the news of the capture of Buenos A res, we were builly employed, owing to the great influx of foreigners ; from the continent, who have been induced to con a here and purchase goods, and expert them at their own rith, notwiththanding the great penalties imposed by the French emper r .-Nothing can equal the hurry and builde we experience fince the intelligence of our facects in South America; not a man, woman, or child, winters to. Wordlets, particularly the mer for, mult be confiderably higher next year, anti cotton goods of all kinds, mutt necessarily advance in price.

The prohibition of certain articles o America, at first excasioned a flight fentation, but on enquiry we found no ground of alarm, as we were informed this government was disposed i litten to and redrefs the grievances complained of by yours, if an inveltiga ion it thould appear there is just cause of complaint, it is however well known to be the practice of neurals (from which it is also known the Americans are not exempte) to cover belligerent properly, and many inflances have occurred during the late and present war, where enemy's prope ty, under neutral sanction has been releated in our vice courts of admiralty, which has afterwards been found to be good and lawful prize; it is therefore not to be wondered at that the innocent is sometimes confounded with the guilty. While government, however, is willing to foster the growing friendship and commerce of both countries, it is necessary that a "corresponding disposition" should be snewn on your part, the non-importation law, however, is not likely to promote this desirable purpose. Great Britain ever has, and ever will be ready to make reparation when she has committed a fault, but it cannot be expected that she will change the dignified attitude she maintains to favor a neutral nation, whose policy appears to be influenced by an unnatural attachment to our enemies."

COM UNICATION.

It has been indirectly communicated, that our affairs with Spain and France are so far adjusted, that nothing remained but to decide upon the mode of paying the American citizens the amount of their various claims.

The price for the Floridas had been agreed upon; the agents for Spain were desirous that the whole price should be paid in transferable stock, and to give drafts upon the Havanna. and other Spanish settlements to satisfy the claims. The advantage to Spain would be the immediate appropriation of lo much without risk or delay, and the chance of capture by the Eritish. The opposition on the part of the American Commissioners, is an apprehension that the Bitish might suppose that the apprepriztion of so much maney in the Spanish colonies by the inftrumentality of the United States, might seem to trespass upon a fair neutrality.

It there things are true, and there are all, there is much reason to hope that a very little time will not only remove those difficulties, but announce to the world, that the Floridas are ours; that the boundaries of Louisiana are adjusted; and that between France, Spain-Britain and the United States, all is peace and good understanding.

[Richmond Enquirer.] BUENOS AYRES.

We hazard the conjecture that the capture of buenos Ayres will increase the disposition of Spain to sell us the Ploridas. If the British could so easily take Buenos Ayres, where is the difficulty in their conquering the Floridas? May not the Spanish court apprehend, that some of the many expeditions from Great Britain may be destined against this settlement? May they not then consider it as good policy to secure the value of it by felling it to our commissioners rather than endanger the possession of the country itself, by keeping it in their own

But there is another way, in which this eventmay operate in favor of a purchase. The whole force of Spain on this continent should be directed to the defence of her South American colonies. She frould not divide her forces between them and the Floridas; and should she withdraw them from the latter, Spain cannot but apprehend that they would at once fall into our hands, in case of hostilities between us.
