Late and Important News.

NEW YORK, Dec. 9.

We announced to the readers of the  
Mercantile Advertiser, and the public,  
the important intelligence that Hostilities  
have commenced on the Continent of  
Europe, between the Prussians and the  
French; and that, after nine days suc-  
cessive and successful fighting, in which  
the Prussians were defeated with dreadful  
carnage, the emperor of the French has  
arrived with his victorious army before  
the city of Berlin. The Duke of  
Brunswick, Prince Ferdinand of Prussia,  
the Prince of Hohenlohe, and many other  
officers of rank, are said to be amongst  
the number of those who in French  
phrasology have "itten the dust."

We are indebted for the detail of these  
events to the arrival at this port of the  
ship Eugenia, captain Boden, in 37 days  
from Amsterdam, who furnished us with  
a file of Dutch papers to the latter end  
of October, and of London papers to the
