Parnet to being forward different fets of papers, with which his vell-I had been originally furni 'red, to avoid duties or captures, and which were interpreted by the agents of the French treasure to be trans's or forgeries.

It is understood to be the intention of Bo. naparte to penetrate immediately into the Russian territories. The French troops on the Weser and the Elbe, with the exception of a few small corps only, left to garrison Hanover, Hamburgh, and Cuxhaven, had been marched for the Vistula. The garrisons left behind consist of Dutch and Italian troops.

Strong reports prevailed in London, Dec. 29, of an engagement between the French and Russians on the Vistuia, in which the latter had lost \$5,000 men in killed, wounded, and prisoners. The report was brought by capt. Lun berr, of the Danish ship Claudina Mar. garetta, from Caer, in Normande, who stated that he heard a bulletin read at the latter place to that effect.
