COW-POX.

Extract of a letter from a Gentleman in Callao,
Peru, South America, dated June 14, 1866,
to his friend in Boston.
"Had I arrived three months earlier with
the vaccine matter in as complete a state as we
brought it here, it would have need me for life,

Mass performed, Te Deums sung and Bon-fires
exhibited. I am always doomed to be three
months too late."
