Ani be it enassel, That it shall be the duty of the constable of every hundred to repair once month, and oftener if information be given him of tumultuous meetings of mulattoes, degroes or liaves, to all suspected places within his hundred and if he shall find any mulasto or negro not a flave at any fuch meeting, it that be the duty of the constable forthwith to Garry such mulatio or negro, to offending, before fome magittrate of the county, who thall thereupen commi. fuch person to the common gaol, unless he or the that enter into a rec gniz ince, with fuch security as said justice shall require, for his or her good behavior, and also to appear before the nex: county court, to antwer for fuels offence in such manner as is prescribed by law for the trial of crimes and mildemeanors within this flate. an if fuch person shall be found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this all, he shall be fined, or impriloned, for such ofience, at the discretion of the court ; and if such constable shall find at any such meeting as ... foresaid, any flave besides those belonging to the wner of fuch place, not having permiss n in writing from his owner or overleer, it finall be lawful for the constable, and he is herely authorised and required, to whip every such slave, at his

discretion, not exceeding thirty-nine "thes. And be it emailed, I hat beture any conflable. shall be entitled to receive the allowance grante ed by the fourth section of the act e titled, Am act to prevent the tumultuous meetings and other irregula ities of negroes and pitter llaves, be shall produce a ceutificate from at least tail 1. f. pectable citizens of his hundred, of his industry and fidelity in the discharge of his duty under

this act and the act above recited. And, f. r a further encouragement to take up runaways, Be it enatled. That in fleu of two hundred pounds'ef tobacco, allowed by the act. entitled, An act relating to fervants and flaves, any person sizing and taking up such runge ways, shall have and receive fix dellars."
