and as this was not the fight, neither could it be the last prosecution to bring to justice those who made it their interests to stain the unsullied character of other. In the newspaper above alluded to, Mr. Paull was represented to have returned thanks to the freeholders of Middlesex for the honor they had done him; to have adverted to the endeavors he had made to bring to justice that great delinquent the Marquis Wellesley. He said that his movive in prosecuting the impeadlment was not from private malice, but from ideas of public justice in dragging forward a person who was guilty of the most lavish prefusion of the public money, and of a mest wanton and atrocious murder, perperrated upon an independent prince who was forced from his throne into a dungeon. The passage from that dungeon to the grave was not long, for he was murdered by the Marquis, and the bloody robes were sent to the mother of the victim as a proof of the commission of the crime. The learned counsel thought that the court would consider that the noble applicant was fully authorised in appearing before their lordships, and would grant the object sought by the motion, against the printer, publisher, and proprietors of the paper in question. Rule to shew cause granted.

Mr. Robison gave notice, that he would on this day se'nnight move for the production of certain papers relative to the barrack department in Great Britain. He should also move on the same day, for papers c unceted with the businers of the barrack department in Iretan !; and probably, on the same day, he might allo move sor papers relative to the barrack department of our colonies.

Mr. Manning apprised the house, that he should think it his duty on some convenient day after the fecond reading of the lave trade abolition bill to move for the house to go into a committee for the purpote of considering of the expediency of granting compensation of those persons who may suffer by the passing of that bill into a law.

Earl Temple moved, that the house resolve itself into a committee on the report of the select committee, to which the Sierra Leone petition was refer.ed. The report stated that it was expedient that certain possessions and rights which are now vested in the Sierra Leone Company flio id be transferred to his majefly. The committee agreed to the subflance of the report, and the house having resumed, leave was granted to brig in a bill pursuant to the terms thercof.

PI NNSYLVANIA LEGISLATURE.

House of Representatives, March 23.

On Tuesday, the 17th instant, Mr. Binney reperted a bill to authorize the governor to subscribe for shares of stock in certain Turnpike Companies - It was founded upon the report of the committee on Roads and In and Navigation, fibmitted some time fince by that gentleman, and was made the order of the day for Friday the 20th. On the afternoon of that day, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole upon this bill, and after a Retement by Mr. B. of the importance of the lubject, the necessity of pursuing a liberal policy in this respect, and the fatal tendency of local jealousies, when indulged upon fuch an occasion, the committee adopted the bill by a large majority. Upon a fecond and third reading, attempts were made to deteat it in an indirect vay, but it triumphed upon buth readings, and pailed the House of Representatives this morning 47 ayes to 27 nays

"The bill directs the governor to subscribe to the amount of 252,000 dollars for fhares of flock in fix companies already i corporate ! among others for 5900 doller in Eatlon and Wilkesbaire, 12,000 in Suquehannah and Tioga, and 30,000 in Sunbury and Reading Tumpike. It was necessary to conciliate both

northern and southern rom advoca es, which upon the principle of the bill is not only fat but beneficial. The money rating from tavern licences and from J. Nicholton's ettate is appropriated to mest this engagement; and as principai and interest are to be invested in stock, until they amount to 300,000 dollars, there will be a balance in less than 9 12 years of 42,000 dollars which in all probability will go to the same object. It remains with the Senare to defiroy or to consummate this excellent plan of internal improvement.

"The House of Representatives came to a resolution this day, to adjourn on Friday the 3d of April. Q It the Senate does not make it the 6th ?"
