Fegulating in ricing and driving of horse and carriages, in the city of Battimore.

.. Dis enacted and ordained by the mayor and city council of Balamore. That the drivers of all coaches, waggons, chairs, sleighs, certs, drays and other curriages of burden or pleasure, driving and passing through the streets, lines or alleys of the care of Latenore, when there is room sufficient for two to pass, shall keep on that side of the street. I use, or alley, on their right hands respectively in the passing direction; and if any driver of a carriage shall drive his said carriage in the mildle of the street, or on the side of the way on his lest hand, so, as to present or obstruct another carriage from passing as aforesaid; every driver so offending, shall for feit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding ave dollars.
