Gen. CRAWFURD's EXPEDITION.

I ONDON, Feb. 12. We have the pleafure of amounting the fafe arrival at St. Jago, on the 14th of December, of the expedition under Gen. Crawfurd. The following letter from a gentleman attached to the expedition is the most gratifying, because we can implicitly rely on the accuracy of our

correspondent; ; Veland of St. Jugo, Dec. 28, 13e5.
