GUN BOATS. - Those who clamor for a Nivi, and yet are host le to the system of defence by Gun-Blats, would seem to be a set of mere co-

It is not in the power of the United States to raile and equip a navy to protect commerce for several centuries; but it is in her power to equip a fleet of gun-boats almost immediately, which would repel, at least, the groffer infults offered her. And yet the very persons who accule the administration for leaving our puris and harbors in a desenceless state, exclaim against the system, which is the only rational one that can be adopted in our present situation. Can such men be the friends of this

country? The following extracts are from a British source, and therefore will not be sligmatized as jacobinical evidence of the utility of Gun-Boats.

Extracts from Walsh's Journal of the Campaign in Egypt, under the command of Sir Ralph

Abercromby-in 1801. Page 84. By affording a harbor for our gunboots, the lake was of the greatest service; their boats exclusive of other advantages, were no small security to our lest flank. It is rather unaccountable that the French, so long masters of this country, did not keep a ftrong force of gun-boats on this station, which would have annoyed us materialy on our landing, or in

any future movements. Battle of 21st March-106 The gun-boats on the right, under command of captain Maitland of the royal navy, were of the most essential service, and did very great execution among the French troops posted behind the sand-hills. 23. Their right was protected by a number

of yun-boats, &c. 209. Several large Turkish gun-boats came in on the 10th and the Capoutan Pacha went to Rosetta to collect as many more as he could. There gun-boats are very large, they have two matts, a main-matt, and short mizen, and are square rigged. They carry a heavy 24 pounder at the bow, end a 12 ponder on each quarter;
