First, At Niagara, Detroit, Michilimackinac, Fort Wayne, Chicago, and at any place or places where troops are or may be stationed, marched or recruited, within the State of Ohio, and territory of Michigan, and at any place or places within the Indiana territory north of the 40th degree of north latitude.

Second, At the new military post, opposite the mouth of the Tennessee, within the Cherokee nation between Tennessee and Georgia, and on the Tennessee river, and on the east and west sides of the river and on the east and west sides of the river and on the east and west sides of the river, and at any place or places where troops are or may be stationed, marched or recruited, within the State of Kentucky and Tennessee.

Eighth, At Norfolk, and at any place or places where troops are or may be stationed, marched or recruited, within the State of Virginia.

Ninth, At Fort Mifflin, and at any place or places where troops are or may be stationed, marched or recruited, within the State of Pennsylvania, east of the mountains and within the State of New Jersey and Delaware.

peck, eighteen ounces of bread or flour, one gill of rum, whiskey or brandy, and at the rate of two quarts of salt, four quarts of vinegar, four pounds of soap, and one pound and a half of candles to every hundred rations. The prices of the several component parts of the ration shall be specified; but the United States reserve the right of making such alterations in the price of the component parts of the ration as may be deemed proper. The price of each part thereof bear a just proportion to the proposed price of the whole ration. The rations are to be furnished in such quantities, that there shall at all times, during the term of the proposed contract, be sufficient for the consumption of the troops at Michilimackinac, Detroit and Chicago for six months in advance; and at each of the other posts on the western waters for at least three months in advance, of good and well selected provisions of the same kind as are required. It is also to be provided that all and every of the commandants of fortified places or posts, or all posts, at all times when the time can be transported, or at any time in case of emergency, such supplies of the provisions in advance, as the discretion of the commandant shall be deemed proper.
It is understood that the contractor is to be a responsible person, and that he is to be bound to the expense and risk of doing the supplies to the troops, and that all losses sustained by the contractor, or any other person, by means of the depredations of an enemy, or by means of the troops of the United States, shall be paid by the United States at the price of the articles captured or detained as aforesaid, on the deposition of two or more persons of creditable character, and the certificate of a commandant of either, stating the circumstances of the loss, and the amount of the articles for which compensation shall be claimed.
The privilege is understood to be reserved to the United States of requiring that none of the supplies, which may be furnished under any of the proposed contracts, shall be used, and the supplies which have been or may be furnished under contracts now in force, have been consumed, and that they apply in advance may be always required at any of the fixed posts on the Kentucky, or Indian frontier, not exceeding three months.
