Merchantable boards must be 3-4 of an inch thick; plank, 11.2 inches; cypress shingles, 17 inches long and 4 broad; hogshead flaves, 3 feet 5 inches long, 3 inches wide, and 3-4 of an inch thick; Boiton shingles, 12 inches long and 3 wide, hhd. hoops, 12 to 14 feet long, 25 in a bundle; all which fall short of this description will not be deemed merchantable. Barrels of flour muft contain at least 196 lbs and barrels of provision 190 lbs net to be merchantable. Articles imported from the U. States are hereafter to pay a duty of one shilling per ton; and to be rated as follows: -- 600 feet of boards, I ton; 3600 fouthern flingles, one ton ;-4000 Bolton thingles, one ten; 2000 clapboards, one ton; 700 dreised or 6000 wrought staves, one ton; 20 hhd. thooks, one ton; 10 barrels of beef, pork or flour, one ton.
