SALEM, May 1.

The Turkish War-By captain William Cook, who arrived here on Wednesday night from Palermo in Sicily, we have some additional parriculars respecting the new-war which has been . commenced between the Turks and Russians, which is likely foon to assume a high degree of interest and importance. The Turks are doubtlel's considered as acting a part assigned them by Bonaparie; and, as was to be expected, the British have made common cause with the Russians against them. We have alredy had some reports of the progress of the Russian arms, under Gen. Michelion, in the direct route for Constantinople.—Captain C. further informs us of the co-operation of a naval force in the expedition against the Ottoman capital. Dispatches had arrived at Sicily, with orders for Sir Sydney Smith to join Admiral Duckworth, and fail with all possible speed for the Dardanelles, to act in concert with the Russians against the Porte; and they sailed, in consequence, on the 26th of January. We do not know the amount of the British force. The Russians were flated to have twenty-five fail of men of war in the Mediterranean, on board of which was a considerable number of troops: and it was expedted that in conjunction they would attack the Dardan effes and pass up to Constantinople. In the mean time tears were entertained for the lafety of Admiral Louis, who with a imall squadron was, by the last advices, above Consta tin ple, & who might therefore be arrefted onhis return into the Archipelago of the Turks in uld be applied ed in leason of the hostility of Great Britain.

Of the war betweentlie French and Russians no interligence could be obtained in that quarter, to be relied on. The accounts were fuch as had passed through French channels, and in general represente. Bo, aparie as having met with little or no oblituction in his victorious career.

Our countrymen at Sicily were highly gratified at receiving, in London prints of the 5th of January, official accounts of the conclution of. a treaty between G. Britain and America; the more fo, as the Paris papers a few days previcus had represented the negociation as likely to fail, and a rupture between the two countries as almost unavoidable. At the same time there was considerable marmaring among the Britiff on the occasion; for, though the conditions of the treaty wereunknown, jet there was agezeral impression that the American commissioners had got the advantage in the negociation, and that the honor and interest of Old Lingland had not been properly maintained.

Business at Naples and Leghorn was extremely dull, and nearly flagnated at the former place, by means of the continual contributions levied on the merchants by the new go-Vernment.

### NEW-YORK, May 5.

CAPTURE OF MONTE VILLDO. Our correspondent at Providence, leas sent us the following intelligence, received at that place by the Favorite, captain Russel, from St. Sal-

" On the 14th of December laft, un English squadron arrived at Rio de Janiero, of 2! fail; among which were the Ardent, of 60 guns, commedere Donnetly; the Unicorn frigate, a floop of war—the rest transports. The troops an board were commanded by general Abeicremby, an American by birtle, and general Limney. The first was authorised to act as governor of the diffrict of Monte Viedo, flamd it be under the dominion of the Englith. The number of troops was given out to be occo, but from a variety of circumliances, it is probable they did not exceed 3000. Great dispatch was uted in watering, aim the squadron latied dor the Hiver Plate on Monday, the 22d of Deconder. The arder of the troops was highly excited at the cruelties perpetrated by the Spamiards on the Englith prisoners, at the recapture of Buenos Ayres, and a spirit appeared to be universal to take ample vengeznee. The Favorite sailed irem St. Salvador on the 5th March; on the morning of which day, an arrival ficm Rio Grande, in 36 days, bro't intelligenee that Monte Viedo was in the hands of the English.-In comparing dates, it is probable it fell between the 10th and 20th of Jan. The news of the capture of this place was bro't to Rio Grande by an English vessel, which was dispatched there by the conquerots for provi-

The private letters received at St. Salvador mention, that the place suffained a close siege of 6 days, and was at length carried by ftorm. They also implied, that the violences committed aster the capitulation of l'uenos Ayres, were fully retaliated 'It would seem from the want of previsions he English suffered after the fall cf Mente Viedo; that their power could not extend far into the country. The Spaniards were extremely exasperated against the Americans, on account of the part acted by cer:ain iudividuals in the conquett of Buenos Ayres; and 22 American vessel arrived from Monte Viedo while the Favorite lay at Rio de Janeiro, which had been permitted by the Englith to proceed to the fermer place, which gave information, that on her approach to the batteries, she was brought to acd a boat dispatched to her, to let her know that if she continued within reach of the batte. ries another hour, they would certainly sink her. The ship Resource, capt. Wm. F. Megee, was at Monte Viede, at t'edute of the last accounts. Capt. Thomas B.
