### BALTIMORE COLLEGE.

At a meeting of the Board of Trustees of Baltimore College, held in the College Apartment, on Monday, May 4th, 1807,

It was resolved, that a committee of eight be appointed to solicit contribution for procuring an apparatus—the committee to confift of the following persons, viz.-

Mr. M'ELDERRY, Mr. PETER LEVERING, Mr. ALEX. M'KIM, Mr. JAMES BIAYS, DOCTR. COULTER, Mr. JOHN M'KIM, Jun. Mr. JAMES A. BUCHANAN, Mr. EDWARD JOHNSON.

From the minutes, JAMES INGLES, Sec. pro. tem. While the munificence of the citizens of Balmore in behalf of literature and tcience, has been diffused through diftant parts of the union, it is hoped and expeded that an institution peculiarly adapted to the instruction of their own youth, will not receive a less liberal testimony of their bountiful regard.

Though a proper prospectus of this institution would at present be premature, yet on impartial engniry, it is presumed, it will appear justified in this call on the liberal patrons & friends of general education in this city.

Some of the most respectable Collegiate Sys-auspices in every respect less favorable, and have extended their alefulness to thousands of the community.

Such institutions cannot be established without public aid : suitable accommodations and apparatus are indispensible. Should these be obtained, it is hoped that a foundation will be laid for the improvement of a large and respectable portion of the youth of Baltimore, in virtue and learning. For these most salutary purposes, the unprejudiced will find, that inflitutions that leave the private residence of the greater part of the youth, under the fanctified shade of parental inspection, are not the less entitled to public encouragement.

The liberal and impartial principles on which this institution is sounded, and on which it is to be conducted, are evident in the following extrad from the charter:

" The said College shall be founded and maintained for ever, upon the most lineral plan, for the benefit of youth of every religious denomination, who shall be freely admitted to equal privileges and advantages of education, and to all the literary honors of the college, according to their merit, without requiring any religious or civil test, or urging their attendance upon any particular plan of religious worship or fervice, other than that they have been educated in, or have the approbation and content of their parents or guardians to attend. Nor shall, any preserence be given in the choice of a principal or professor, master or tutor, in the said college, on account of his particular religious profession, but regard shall be paid solely to his moral character, literary abilities and other necessary qualifications to fill the office for which he shall be chosen.

BRITISH NAVAL APPOINTMENTS. Lieutenant T. Pike is appointed to the Tonant, of 80 guns; Lieutenant R. Mansel, to the Gossack of 22; Lieutenant Kranison, to the Guilford, of 74; Lieutenant Dick, to the Temeraire, of 98; and Lieutenant Boys, to the Corso, of 16 guns.

The Bulwark, of 74 guns, was to have been launched at Portsmouth, (England) on the 23d April.

The persons sent from New-York to give evidence on the trial of captain Whitby, of the Leander, arrived in London 7th April. We have already mentioned that captain W. was acquitted on the 17th April.

[Boston paper.] By accounts received at this pott as well as at Norfolk, there is good ground for the belief that the brig Eutaw, of this port has been captured by the British frigate Melampus, off Cape Henry. A flatement having appeared in a N. Y. paper, that said brig had fired at an American veffel, the probability is, that if shedid so, she must have been in possession of the British at the time.

Extract of a dispatch from gen. Benningsen, dated, " H. Q. Landsberg, Feb. 27, 1807. " I left Konigsberg on the 25th, and am at the enemy's heels. They continue their retreat in extreme disorder ... The cannon, waggons, caisons and baggage, are the only obfacles which they seem anxious to oppose tous. My advanced guard, which has been considerably reinforced by the Cossacks of the Don, harrais them incessantly, and always with considerable success. According to the most accurate reports we have taken prisoners, fince the battle of Eylau, 48 officers, 70 Subalterns and 3,205 foldiers, not including 300 others, who died of their wounds. The reinforcements which I exped from Russia are already on their march; and their early arrival will enable me to follow. with as much precision as considence, the plan of operations which I have laid down. The garrison of Dantzic has made another fortie gainst the Polish insurgents, and has completely beaten themneat Dirichau."
