BALTIMORE COLLEGE.

At a meeting of the Board of Trustees of Baltimore College, held in the College Apartment, on Monday, May 4th, 1867,

It was resolved, that a committee of eight be appointed to solicit contributions for procuring an apparatus—the committee to consist of the following persons, viz.—

While the munificence of the citizens of Baltimore in behalf of literature and science, has been diffused through distant parts of the union, it is hoped and expected that an institution peculiarly adapted to the instruction of their own youth, will not receive a less liberal testimony of their bountiful regard.

Though a proper prospectus of this institution would at present be premature, yet on impartial enquiry, it is presumed, it will appear justified in this call on the liberal patrons & friends of general education in this city.

Some of the most respectable Collegiate Students on this continent, have commenced under auspices in every respect favorable, and have extended their attentions to thousands of the community.

Such institutions cannot be established without public aid: suitable accommodations and apparatus are indispensable. Should these be obtained, it is hoped that a foundation will be laid for the improvement of a large and respectable portion of the youth of Baltimore, in virtue and learning. For these most salutary purposes, the unprejudiced will find, that institutions that leave the private residence of the greater part of the youth, under the sanctified shade of parental inspection, are not the less entitled to public encouragement.

The liberal and impartial principles on which this institution is founded, and on which it is to be conducted, are evident in the following extracts from the charter:

"The said College shall be founded and maintained for ever, upon the most liberal plan, for the benefit of youth of every religious denomination, who shall be freely admitted to equal privileges and advantages of education, and to all the literary honors of the college, according to their merit, without requiring any religious or civil test, or urging their attendance upon any particular plan of religious worship or service, other than that they have been educated in, or have the approbation and consent of their parents or guardians to attend. Nor shall any preference be given in the choice of a principal or professor, master or tutor, in the said college, on account of his particular religious profession, but regard shall be paid solely to his moral character, literary abilities and other necessary qualifications to fill the office for which he shall be chosen."

By accounts received at this port as well as at Norfolk, there is good ground for the belief that the brig Etaw, of this port has been captured by the British frigate Melampus, off Cape Henry. A statement having appeared in a N. Y. paper, that said brig had fired at an American vessel, the probability is, that if shedd so, she must have been in possession of the British at the time.

Extract of a dispatch from gen. Benningfen, dated, "H. R. Landberg, Feb. 27, 1867." "I left Konigsberg on the 25th, and am at the enemy's heels. They continue their retreat in extreme disorder. The cannon, wagons, caissons and baggage, are the only obstacles which they seem anxious to oppose to us. My advanced guard, which has been considerably reinforced by the Cossacks of the Don, harras them incessantly, and always with considerable success. According to the most accurate reports we have taken prisoners, since the battle of Eylau, 48 officers, 70 subalterns and 3,253 soldiers, not including 300 others, who died of their wounds. The reinforcements which I expect from Russia are already on their march, and their early arrival will enable me to follow, with as much precision as confidence, the plan of operations which I have laid down. The garrison of Danzig has made another sortie against the Polish insurgents, and has completely beaten them near Ustronau."
