THE LATEST FROM THE CONTINENT OF EUROPE.

SALEM, June 5.—On Wednesday last the Hopewell, capt. Ita, arrived here from Hamburg, which place she left on the 17th April.

With respect to the events of war which had taken place between the French and Russians, it was difficult to judge of the truth from the Hamburg papers, as they are issued under the inspection of a French intendant of public and official statements, there is generally a distrust, from the supposed policy of each party to conceal its own disasters, and exaggerate those of its enemy: private information is therefore often more relied on.

The greatest exertions were making on both sides to repair their losses by recruits. Vast numbers were pouring in to the French grand army, from all parts of Germany, as well as from France, thousands of wretched creatures being obliged to enlist, to get bread; and even many of the Prussian prisoners had entered among the recruits.

There are now no French troops in Hamburg; the place is garrisoned by the Dutch; the river is blockaded by the British, and its trade has ceased.

Of the four wives he had before me, the last he quarrelled away, how the other three came by their deaths he can best inform the public—but I caution all widows or maidens against marrying him, be their desire for matrimony ever so strong. Should he make his advances under a feigned name; they may look out for a little flattery, calumny, feeble, meagre, hatched face fellow, with spindle shanks, and a little warpt in the back!

Our Correspondent at the Lazaretto, under date of yesterday noon, writes us as follows:—"Last night, arrived Choctaw Jefferson, captain Goff, 24 days from Kingston, Jam. with Rum, &c., to R. Ritchie. Sailed in company with the English fleet, also the ship Eliza, Parker, for Philadelphia. Capt. G. left at Kingston the brig Eliza, for Havana, in a few days. Came passenger, capt. Jones, of the ship Pilgrim, taken coming from St. Bartholomew, to St. Domingo."

By Capt. Hunt, of the ship Miserva, from New-Orleans, we learn that General Wilkinson continued at that place the 4th May, and it was understood did not mean to come on to the United States. Gen. Claiborne has taken his passage in the ship Comet, for Baltimore to sail in a few days.
