This will carry us into the latter end of October or beginning of November, at which sime it is likely congress, will be convened. They will then have before them the materials for the exercise of an enlightened judgment; they will be able to ascertain whether we are to consider Britain as our friend or enemy, and by knowing the extent as well as the nature of the danger to be apprehended, be able to take such measures, of war or commercial reflictions, as shall best promote our own interests, and most severely afect those of the enemy.
