On the 6th inflant I went there as niual; and in the course of our conversation on the topics of the day, I expressed my regret at the sanguinary asfair off the Capes, and lamented the defencelels fiate of Baltimore; obletving, that a few frigates might get up and would play the d-1 with us: I also gave it-as my opinion that the bett disciplined army in the world could not take possession of Halifax, it being desended by nature as well as art. I hele topics certrinly were the chief heads, and I believe the whole fubjects of our discourle, and for the candor and fincerity of my flatement I feleminly appeal to God. On leaving the shop, and finding the Doctor somewhat irii ated and houted, I exclaimed-" I'll b d-d if I do not desend this place at the cann n's mouth or at the point of

the bayonet as fir n as any man in it." Certain persons having heard the recital of thele circumitances, releunded them with aggrevated coloring. which has tinded to in-Came the minds of the citizens on Fell's Point against mc. But with what propriety can I be charged with acting or speaking in any manner der gavory to the interest or honor of this country, trem the preceding relation of facts ! And porticularly when it is known that I have adopted this as my future place of abode; that I rejested a lucrative offer made to me by the parents of my wife it I would remain, in England; that I have fent for her to come to America to partake of my fortunes in the land which I have adopted; and that of the fixe engagements in Mich I have been, the only one in which I was wounded was in defence of American property. Will not two wounds-one in my thigh and one on my forchead-together with a present of 100 guineas for my efforts, attest my devotion to the interests of the United States? Or will my well known and declared intention of joining the Fell's l'oint corps of Artillery, be adduced against me as a proof of my hostility to this nation and of my friendship for the British? I have been accustomed to discourse of maritime affairs und naval tadics, it being a subject with which I am conversant and on which I like to speak; and surely in a free country a man is not to be deprived of the privilege of talking on fuch a topic whilst he conforms to the rules of propriety-Their I neyer have violated, nor uttered a sentiment calculated to wound the feelings of the warment patriot; and when the day of peril comes, no man would more willingly volumeer his fervices

in desence of the union than myself. Before I conclude, I solemnly déclare that the expressio: a I made use of as above, were not jutended to infult or degrade the honor or valor of the American name.
