are finted for the cultivation of this valuable plant; the other, by sliewing how much an individual may benefit his country by availing himself of opportunities in his power to encourage our citizens generally, when peculiar circumstauces offer the means, to attempt the naturalization of other foreign plants.

We cannot close this article without the notice of one important effect that may flow from the introduction of this species of rice plant into this country.-None but blacks are able, it is said, to cultivate low land rice; and this circumstance has been urged as a reason for slavery. This will be altogether removed in case a sufficient quantity of rice can be raised more profitably from dry than overflowed ground, and the latter be more advantageously devoted to meadow, which, under a proper management, must afford a higher profit than any other purpose to which it can be de-

The two ringleaders are Englishmen born; their names are John Cross, alias Daniel Crosswright, and Robert Warrington. The former has since given himlelf up as a deserter from his majetty's thip Warrior. The ship had a great many dollars on board, with other treafore, of which they intende i to plunder her.
