WHEREAS the President of the United States, by his Proclamation, dated at Washington, the second day of July 1807, issued in consequence of the late outrage committed ou our national honor, by the attack of the British ship Leopard on the Chesapeake, " for the avowed purpose of taking, by force, four Seamen previously ascertained to be native born 'Americans," has required that all. armed vessels, bearing commissions under the government of Great Britain, to depart immediately, and without delay, from the harbours and waters of the U. States; and has interdicted the entrance of them, or any ships bearing commissions, under the authority of the British government, into the said harbours or waters; and has forbid all intercourse with them, their officers or crews; and has prohibited all supplies, or aid, to be furnished them: and enjoined it on all persons bearing office, civil or military, under the U. States, and all others, citizens or inhabstants thereof, with vigilance and promptitude, to exert their authorities, and be aiding & assisting, to carry the same Proclamation into tal effect, whereby it fully appears, that the I'retident has determined to use all the means ingiulled to him to enforce obedience to the same. have therefore thought proper to issue the **Sollowing**

The commanding officers of divisions, brigades, regimeints and extra battallions, residing in the vicinity of the Chesapeake and its waters, in the State of Maryland, will be vigilant In guarding against the violation of said prociamation, and prompt to rejel every attempt to violate the lame, within its limits, by the exereise of to much of the terce under their respective cuminauds as may be necessary for the occasion.

They then proecceled to sink calls for the purpose of obtaining water; and as it is calculated they will land for the water, the militia of the neighborhood have put themselves in readingl's to receive them.

Melay Soliman, Emperor qu Merocco, issued on the 9th of May latt an order, directing that no vescels in ballaft or empty, and which are no laden with goods suitable for the consump tion of the country, be sunered to remain at Megadore.

A decilive Victory was gained by the Forces of Algiers over the toups of the Bey of Tunis about the 15th of May in the neighborhood of Configntine—the news of which occasioned great rejoicings at Algiers.
