She spins, makes cloths and kills stockings for bread, which givs her a scanty pittance and would gladly hire heiself per month, for what our tradesmen get per day. But, when it is considered that these people lose at least one half of their time in selling their produce, buying grain, carryng it to mill, and sometimes with young children, which they are obliged to leave at home (hardly large enough to fear the fire,) their situation is bad trough, and, in times of carcity, desperate. Those who are living in ease and luxury in our own country, hardly know that many wo nen of ingenuity and industry will work in times of plenty for 11-2 to 2 dollars per month(" bid and board found,") and this year (when grain is approaching to the European low price of I dollar 1-4 to I dollars 1-2 per bushel.) they will work for their bread, * is not tha wages of labor low enough to efford profit on stock. Poverty has driven many poor women from the paths of virtue to it famy. Can no employment be found for them that will make their situation more independent, and make their small wages certain to them?—And would it not be well for the wealthy generally to step forward and encourage labor saving machinery. Our country abounds with raw materials, we only want artists to put them in operation, and we should consider that our own daughters may in turn be personally benefitted by our exer-
