On the 7th inst. (the day on which they were  
printed) there was stolen from the printing room  
of the Hager's-Town Bank, four half sheets, or  
impressions of printed notes, each half sheet  
containing 4 notes, viz. one of 100 dollars, one  
of 10 dollars, one of 5 dollars, and one post  
note, all blank; and as none struck from the  
same plate have been issued by the bank,  
except eight 100 dollar notes, from No. 1 to  
No. 8, inclusive, or will be issued until the  
stolen notes are recovered, the counterfeiters  
may readily be detected. The 10 dollar and 5  
dollar notes are No. C; all of the same denomi-  
nation which have been issued, are No. A  
and B. of course no 10 dollar or 5 dollar notes  
No. C. are in circulation, out counterfeiters, or  
any of 100 dollars, except eight. The stolen  
notes are badly executed, being printed by a  
person who did not understand the business;  
they have a nutty appearance, and two of the  
10 dollar notes, which I have seen and which  
were detected in Baltimore, are very badly  
filled up and signed.

The above reward will be given for apprehend-  
ing and prosecuting to conviction, the  
person who has or may forge the filling up and  
signatures of any of the said stolen notes, or  
who has or may pass any of them with a knowl-  
edge of the forgery.
