100 Dollars Reward.

On the 7th inst. (the day on which they were
printed) there was stolen from the printing room
of the Hager's-Town Bank, four half sheets,
or impressions of printed notes, each half sheet
containing 4 notes, viz. one of 100 dollars, one
of 10 dollars, one of 5 dollars, and one post
note, all blank; and as none struck from the
same plate have been issued by the bank,
except eight 100 dollar notes, from No. 1 to
No. 8, inclusive, or will be issued until the
stolen notes are recovered, the counterfeiters
may readily be detected. The 10 dollar and 5
dollar notes are No. C; all of the same deno-
