lock and Henry Laton in this city, the prisoner a notorious swindler. On the 4th day of August prisoner called at the stables of Somerindyke in New-street, and requested to have horse and chair to carry him to Bloomingdale, faying he should return in about three hours. He called himself Denmead, and gave No. 144 Water ftreet as the number of his house. Somerindyke, tho' he liked not the man's countenance, and was arongly predispoied to believe him a knave, permitted him with Laton's consent to take the horse and chair, and purfue his proposed journey. When the limited time mentioned by Riley had expired and he did not return as he had promised, the owners of the property became uneasy and one of them pursued him to Bloomingdale. Not receiving any intelligence of him there, he was the next day pursued on the Albany Road, and after considerable difficulty overtaken at the diftance of about 60 miles. He was seized in bed at a tavern on a bye-road, and floutly denied any knowledge of the horse and chair : but being confronted by Laton, he confessed that they were in his possession, and that he intended to take them into Canada. A woman accompanied him as his travelling companion. He had fastened a trunk weighing about 50 lbs. containing his clothes, &c. under the carriage. The horse was very much jaded; and on his return to Newyork, accompanied by Mr. Laton, when they came to a convenient bye-place, at a distance from any habitation, Riley jumped out of the chair, and presented a pittol to Laton's breaft, demanded his horfe. Laton immediately diffmounted, and Riley road off with all possible expedition. The people belonging to a farm house a few miles distant being alarmed by Laton, went in pursuit of Hiley, and over took him. He was fecured a fecond time, brought to Newyork, and committed to bridewell. On his trial be offered no jullification r but called upon four witnesies to tellify to the honesty of his life, and the purity of his character. The first did not know him; the second knew him only from his having once applied to the witness for legal advice; the thirs accused him of fraud; and the fourth was Mr. Denmeud, an indutrious and respectable mechanic whose name he had affirmed. Ar. Biake, the council for the priloner, contended with much ingenuity that the crime imputed to Riley amounted only to a common fraud, and that the indifferent could not be supported. The court coincided in that opinion - The jury, however, thought otherwise: they brought in a verdice of Guilly, and the court fentenced him to 5 years hard labor in the state prison, subject to the revision of the judges at the next sitting of the supreme Court.
