Every day, auring the trial of this notorious man, have a ceriain description of men been exclaiming Great man! how collect d! how composed; how elegant his la iguage, how peripicuous, yet how concile and energetic; how graceful and command ng his a.. i udes, a great nan! a very great man indeed.

A, ain, I deny it.
