or to effect a dismemberment, or separation of the United States, or any territory thereof, and be thereof convicted, by confession or verdict, or shall of malice stand mute, or peremptorily challenge above the number of twenty junors, shall be adjudged a felon, and snall suffer death as in cases of felony, without benefit of cler-

And be it further enacted, That whereas the public good and the security of the government of the United St tes requires, that all traitorous conspiracies and insurrections against the peace, government, & dignity of the United Stat s, should meet with exemplary punishment, and not escape therefrom, because some of the traitorous acts of such offender may with design or otherwise have been committed out of the state or territory where the trial is constitutionally held. I herefore, from and after the passing of this act, every court of the United States, or of any territory thereol, having jurisdiction for the tril of any person charge with having committed treason, or any of the aloresaid offences, within such state or territory where the tria: is had, shall be, and is hereby vested with power and authority, to hear and determine upon the whole of the evidence against such offender, although part of such evidence may r late to some of the treasonable acts committed without such state or territory, but being connected with, and forming a part of the offence charged against him to hav ben committed within such state or territory where the trial is had, it shall be good evidence to go to the jury, and the jury shall bring in their verquet upon the whole of said evidence, any thing in any law, or statute to the | Sch'r Rachel, Prior, contrary notwithstanding.

The foreign News in to-day's American will be found interesting. The letter signed by John Richardson is ample proof of the sensibility of the British manufacturing and commercial interests to the importance of the continuation of peace with America. The general complexion, indeed, of all the articles furnished from England by the arrivals at Newyork, are lavorable to an amicable adjustment of differences with the U.S. We find, in reality, there are still in England enlightened and jus in n who perecive the true interests of the British Empire, and r ind pendent and bold enough to point them out. It is with approbation that we name harl Stanhope; who, in the British House of Lords on the 18t of August declared, alluding to the affair of the Chesap ake, that " The subject in question was one which ought to be settled on general franciples, independent of this particular occurrence, and whether individual nations were more or less powerful. By the live of nations all were equal. It was this principle which alone ought to direct and lay the foundation for any principle of general policy." The Earl alluded to several other important particulars, daugerous to G. Britain in case of a war with America. The whole speech will be given t -morrow, tog-ther with the lord chancellor's reply, which was completely jesuitical. The King of England is totally blind.

The room which military notices have occupied in their usual form heretofore, has compelled us to resort to an expedient to bring them into a smaller compass.
