MARINE INTELLIGENCE.

Left at Lisbon about the middle of August, the Charles, Chase, of Baltimore. At Bermuda, Sept. 4, ship Erin, Patterson, for Baltimore, ready for sea. At Gravesend, early in August, Globe, Bailey, for Baltimore. At Constan[t]a, late in July, Messenger, of Salem, for Baltimore. At Trinidad, September 6, ship Margaret, Heard, from Batavia, bound to Baltimore, prize to the British letter of marque Dominica Packet—it was supposed her cargo would be condemned as Dutch property. Captain Heard was at Barbadoes attending the trial.

Cleared from Boston Sept. 23, Catherine, Shores, for Baltimore.

Spoke, Sept. 11, long, 61, the William Wilson, of Baltimore, from Amsterdam, Aug. 29th, lat. 45, 28, long. 30, 30, ship France, 24 days from Baltimore for Liverpool. Sept. 5, lat. 50, 36, long. 35, 32, ship Hibernia, from Baltimore for Tönning. Sept. 13, a schooner from Baltimore for Anjiu. Sept. 19, brig Susanna, 116 days from Smyrna, for Baltimore—who informed capt., "Smyrna was blockaded by the Russians."

The sch'r Sincerity, King, from New-York for St. Croix, was completely wrecked on the 25th of August in a severe hurricane; and John Chappell, cook, and a black boy of Mr. De Luy, were lost. The schooner however reached her port of destination, and it was to be sold on the 7th inst. for the benefit of the owners.

Below at New-York on Friday evening last, two ships—the brig Havana Packet for Havana—and two schooners—the wind still southerly. One of the schooners is the Margaret, of Portland, from P. Quoddy.

The brig Syren, Sulter, arrived at Kingston, (Jama.) from Philadelphia the 29th of August. Off Cape Tiburon, she was boarded by the French imperial sch'r Musquito, who took out two of her crew, and gave the master a note, assigning his reasons for doing so.

The Peterell sloop of war also arrived at Kingston on the same day, from a cruise; she brought in with her the American schooner Princess Ann, of Norfolk, with 30,000 lbs. of coffee, cut out of Jerome on the 20th inst. by her boats, on which occasion Dickins and one seaman were wounded, the former slightly, but the other has since died. At the time she was taken possession of 50 of Petion's troops were on board, who had been hired by the American captain to defend his vessel under an assurance from him that he understood a French privateer was to make an attempt to cut her out. Two of these men were killed, and 6 wounded, one of the m. their commander, dreadfully; the remainder jumped overboard, and it is supposed perished, as the sch'r lay at the distance of nearly a mile and a half from land.

The sch'r Mayaguana, Sano, was immediately dispatched from Jerome, under D. Nish colors, with dispatches to vice admiral Da Costa, on the Jamaica station. The dispatches related to the capture of the Prince Asso, before mentioned—and the vessel has since been given up to the owner.
