

Fell's Point, tables of mounting, 24 cannons. When a frigate was to be built here Mr. Hollingsworth was the person who prepared materials, who had the timber cut and rafted to this place, attending the whole in person, in a very eminent manner. For Mr. Hollingsworth's exertions the winters of 1784 and 1784, which were extremely severe, and since that period for the alleviation of the miseries of the poor, an appeal may be made to all the old residents of the city; his benevolence has been unwearied and without end. It may now be safely affirmed, that no person in this city has been more generally useful than Jesse Hollingsworth, and that it is impossible that he should in the most remote degree have ever wished to oppress a poor man.

As his enemies have undertaken to calumniate him into the commission of wrong acts while he was in the legislature, it may be proper to state some of his services while there. To him more than any other person, are citizens of this state indebted for the exemption from an emission of paper money to the amount of \$300,000 which was a very favorite measure of some of the leading men then in power, and if it had been effected, its evil effects would not even at this day have been obliterated. And at the close of the session when many of the members had departed for their homes, a Demand was made on the house for a debt due a house in Hb and by the state of Maryland, accompanied with a threat that if it was not paid they would send frigates into the Bay and seize as much shipping as would satisfy them. Some of the members of the legislature alarmed at this threat, brought in a bill to provide for paying the debt, by taxing every bushel of Wheat, Barrel of Flour and Hogshead of Tobacco exported from the state, but by the strenuous opposition Mr. H. gave this bill it was finally rejected; the debt has since been paid in another way.

These observations are made by a person who has for many years known Mr. Hollingsworth, and as he is a candidate could not forbear doing him the justice to make them public at the present time he is sorry to see some opposition to him on account of the extension of Pratt Street; but as this is a question of interest only, and as the number of interested persons is not very great, I hope it may not prevent his election.
