FOR apprehending and securing in Baltimore jail, my apprentice boy, named JACOB VANFREISWACK, aged 18 or 19 years, about 5 feet 3 inches high; very stout and strong for his age; fair complexon, and good features; short thick brown har, inclined to curl; his hands very large. He is a native of Holland, and was bound an apprentice to me on board of the brig George, of Baltimore, in the year 1800, at Rotte-tam, frem thence he made a voyage with me to Biltimore, and from thence to Ameterdam, and back to Baltimore in 1503. He was at school with Mr. Harrove, where he remained for several receiths.
