General JOHN MASON, of the district of Columbia, to be Superintendent of Indian Affairs vice Gen. Shee, appointed Collector of the port of Philadelphia.

W. 5 leagues distant was boarded by the British frigate Milan and treated politely. Passed several vessels in the bay bound up, among them a large ship.
