Jacob can read a little, and sometimes attempts to write, but cannot make his letters plain enough to be understood; when he first came to country, in 1802, I boarded him with Captain, Goose on the Point; and he went to school a few months to Mr. Gardner. He speaks the English language very plain, and has but little of the Dutch dialect: I think that he has forgot the most of his mother tongue.
