 Resolved, That a committee be appointed to enquire into the expediency of extinguishing the claims of the United States, to certain balances reported to be due from several of the states, to the United States, by the commissioners appointed to settle the accounts of the individual states with the United States, and that the said committee have leave to report by bill or otherwise.

On motion by *V. Milledge*, Resolved, That the members of the Senate, from a sincere desire of throwing every mark of respect due to the memory of the honorable Abraham Baldwin, deceased, late a member thereof, will go into mourning for him one month, by the usual mode of wearing a crape round the left arm.
 On motion by *Mr. Hillhouse*, a similar resolution was passed in relation to Mr. Tracy.
