

The part which most distinguishes this Animal is the head, which though small inspires some degree of terror-It is here of feathers, and armed with an helmet of horny substance, black before, and yellow believed. The neck is of a violet colour, and red in several places. The Cassowary has the head of a Warrior, the eye of a Lion, the delence of a Porcupine, and the swiftness of a Courser.
